# Forthcoming events

Indigenous Peoples Forum (10-13 February 2017, Rome) Economic empowerment of indigenous peoples, with a focus on women and youth will be the theme for the third global meeting of the Indigenous Peoples Forum at IFAD headquarters. During preparatory regional workshops held in Africa (Congo-Brazzaville), Asia (Cambodia), Latin America (El Salvador) and the Pacific (Fiji), indigenous women reiterated their needs to become economically empowered: i) free from all forms of violence; ii) have access to ancestral territories; and iii) have adequate resources to progress in their development. Indigenous youth indicated that for them empowerment means participating in decision-making. Read more: Event website

# **16-days campaign against gender-based violence** (25 November - 10 December, Rome)

IFAD participated in the UN Campaign 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence, which started on the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women (25 November) and ended on Human Rights Day (10 December). During the campaign, IFAD mobilized staff and hosted learning events on *Violence is everyone's problem* (in collaboration with IFAD Medical Services Team) and *Gender equality is also a men's issue* (in collaboration with the WFP Men Stand For Gender Equality Group). # **Updates from the Joint Programme on Rural Women's Economic Empowerment** (RWEE, 6-13 November 2016, Rwanda)

Representatives of IFAD, WFP and UN Women carried out a joint mission and assessment of the RWEE operational situation in Rwanda and developed a strategy for its continuation. Field visits confirmed substantive progress and achievements in programme implementation, including on using the Household Methodologies approach. Once again this approach proved to be crucial for unlocking a household's development potential and will be scaled up in other RWEE target areas.

#### Empowering Women to End Hunger (19 October 2016, Rome)

The Rome Network for Gender Equality and Women's Empowerment, FAO, IFAD, WFP and UN Women organized a side event on "Empowering Women to End Hunger: Lessons from the Joint Programme on Accelerating Rural Women's Economic Empowerment". The side event took place during 43rd session of the Committee on World Food Security and focussed on the impact of the Joint Programme on overall food security and nutrition in target areas. Panellists identified core strengths of the Joint Programme including: close collaboration of the four participating agencies with local communities; inclusion of climate-resilient agricultural approaches in training and capacity building programmes; and meaningful engagement of men. ## General Recommendation No. 34 on rural women (22 November 2016)

FAO, IFAD, WFP, UN Women and the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) launched the landmark <u>General Recommendation No. 34</u> (2016) of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) on the rights of rural women, in a joint event held at FAO. Participants discussed the role of the United Nations and civil society in facilitating the integration of gender equality and women's empowerment issues into policies, legislation and investment strategies to close the gender gap and combat hunger. **Read more:** General Recommendation No. 34

# Traditional cuisine highlights nutrition across afro-descendant communities (26-29 October 2016, Colombia)

Four African women beneficiaries from IFAD-supported programmes in Benin, Senegal and Zambia participated in an event on traditional cuisine, culture and knowledge which took place in Buenaventura, the first "African city" of Colombia. This event, jointly organized by the <a href="Afro-descendants Cultural Assets">Afro-descendants Cultural Assets</a> Foundation and IFAD, offered participants an opportunity to share their experiences and techniques regarding preparing traditional cuisine, protecting biodiversity and using local products.

# A success story of a woman entrepreneur from the Artisanal Fisheries Promotion Project (PROPESCA, Mozambique)

Doña Eugénia Araújo Massitela is a fish trader who received training in handling, processing and trading fresh fish as well as in business management. She has participated in fish trade fairs organized by PROPESCA to improve incomes and access to markets. Under the special fund for women entrepreneurs, an innovative financial instrument promoted by the project, Doña Eugénia is eligible to receive a matching grant to purchase two coolers. With her knowledge of how to process and conserve large fish, meet the required quality standards, and access finance, she has become an entrepreneur in high-quality fish trading and a model not only for other women.

## IFAD's support for legal defence for vulnerable women: a success story from Burundi

"The community and family development centres have helped me a lot," said 52-year-old Consolate with tears in her eyes. She had given birth to two daughters and could not become pregnant again. Her husband wanted a son and took a second wife to live with him in the family home. He and his family treated Consolate badly and wanted her to leave the house. She went to the village chief for help but he refused to intervene. At that time she was attending meetings organized by the "Integrated Forestry Community Development Project." (PRODEFI) in Burundi and heard about the legal assistance provided by the community and family development centres. With their support she went to court and introduced a claim on her share of the family property.

This project, funded by IFAD and implemented by Bolivia's Ministry of Development Planning, aims to

strengthen food security for rural people living in extreme poverty and provide opportunities for them to increase their incomes. Women substantially benefit from capacity development opportunities, especially on financial and purchasing processes, which have enabled them to create legal business entities, obtain Tax Identification Numbers and access financial services and resources they need to invest in their activities and their future.
