Gilbert Fossoun Houngbo, former Prime Minister of Togo, was appointed as the sixth President of the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) at the Fortieth Session of the IFAD Governing Council (14-15 February 2017). He will take office on 1 April 2017, succeeding Kanayo F. Nwanze, who was President for two terms beginning in April 2009. "Women in a Changing World of Work: Planet 50-50 by 2030" was the theme for 2017. Particular attention was paid to women's work and employment as key components of the fight against hunger, malnutrition and rural poverty. The Rome-based agencies organized a joint event, hosted by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), on the topic "Step It Up Together with Rural Women to End Hunger and Poverty". Rome: Indigenous Peoples Forum

"Economic Empowerment of Indigenous Peoples, with a Focus on Women and Youth" was the theme of the third global meeting of the Indigenous Peoples Forum (10-13 February 2017). In their "Synthesis of Deliberations", participants made recommendations for promoting the economic empowerment of indigenous women and youth, including the importance of supporting their participation in all development processes, guaranteeing the inclusion of their needs and priorities in development plans and allocating sufficient resources to support them. Indigenous peoples' representatives also enjoyed a private meeting with Pope Francis during the visit (15 February 2017).

Rome: Training sessions for gender focal points

The Gender Team is launching a set of capacity-building activities for the key actors implementing its gender and targeting policies. Nepal: Catalysing change and action with the Gender Action Learning System

To build the capacities of their project staff in Nepal and Pakistan and to support its partners, including IFAD, Oxfam Novib organized a learning workshop on the Gender Action Learning System (GALS) in Nepal (27 February - 3 March 2017). In collaboration with Oxfam Novib, IFAD has been promoting the

adoption of GALS and other household methodologies in value chain development, rural finance and agricultural extension. A GALS workshop also took place in Kenya, in support of the Smallholder Dairy Commercialization Programme (SDCP) and Upper Tana Natural Resource Management Project (UTANRMP).

Retreat of IFAD Central America Team

Zanzibar: An old woman farmer with a young business vision

Khadija Suleiman, 70, migrated from the mainland of the United Republic of Tanzania to Pemba, Zanzibar, when she was just 12 years old. Her family was involved in farming and livestock-raising. The lack of adoption of best agricultural practices prevented her from maximizing the productive capacity of her 12-acre farm. Impressed by the results of a nearby sweet potato grower, she joined a farmer field school (FFS) operating in her village, which was supported by the IFAD-funded Agricultural Sector Development Programme - Livestock (ASDP-L). Here she learned several best practices from fellow farmers and FFS facilitators, including: (i) selection of seedlings; (ii) proper land preparation; and (iii) spacing and application of farmyard manure. "The FFS approach was an eye opener that made me realize that I could fulfil my dreams despite my age. For more information, please contact: Stefano Consiglio

India: Kitchen gardens for better nutrition

The Tejaswini Madhya Pradesh Rural Women's Empowerment Programme (Tejaswini-MP) is in the last year of implementation. Implemented by Mahila Vitta Vikas Nigam (MVVN), it has established 16,389 self-help groups (SHGs) with a total membership of 204,281 households, 2,630 village-level committees and 60 federations.
