Director General, IFPRI

Johan Swinnen is Director General of the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI), and Global Director of the Systems Transformation Science Group at CGIAR. Prior to joining IFPRI, Dr. Swinnen was professor and director of the LICOS Centre at KU Leuven (Belgium) and senior research fellow at the Centre for European Policy Studies.

Dr. Swinnen earned his PhD from Cornell University and holds honorary doctorates from University of Göttingen and the Slovak University of Agriculture (Slovakia). He is a Fellow of the Agricultural & Applied Economics Association and the European Association of Agricultural Economists and served as president of the International Association of Agricultural Economists from 2012 to 2015.

Dr. Swinnen has published extensively, and is widely cited, on agricultural and food policies, international development, political economy, institutional reforms, trade, and global value chains. For more information see his webpage or CV.
