| | What exactly do you mean with in-kind contribution? | With in-kind contribution we understand a non- cash contribution in the form of a good, work or service that provides support for both non-profit and for-profit organizations. It may consist either of the direct provision of a tangible asset to the project, or of an expenditure incurred directly by the contributor, benefiting the project and facilitating the meeting of its objectives. In-kind domestic cofinancing or contributions include: (i) goods; (ii) works; (iii) use of services and facilities (for example, office space); (iv) professional services or expertise in the form of staff time; (v) provision of or access to equipment and special materials; and (vi) exemptions from tax that would otherwise need to be paid by the project in order to carry out its activities. In-kind contributions represent a stream and-or source of revenue, and although they are not monetary, they may represent a significant portion of the project's revenue. |

Can you please clarify the procedure and timing in the proposal process for applying for a waiver? | Although the ceiling for indirect costs is 8%, IFAD will accept an 11% ceiling for CGIAR centers (excl. the 2% Trustee fee). For other institutions the cap is at 8%. |
