Overview

Many thanks for accepting to take part in the Opening Ceremony of <u>Global Model United Nations</u> (GMUN) 2021 which will be held on **Wednesday**, **7 July 2021**, from **10:00** to **11:30** CEST.

GMUN is a simulation of the work of the United Nations (UN), organized by the public universities of Rome and the International Fund for Agricultural Development of the UN (IFAD).

The Opening Ceremony, which will be live streamed on IFAD's YouTube account, will be moderated by **Ms Sara Savastano**, Director of IFAD's Research and Impact Assessment Division. The Opening Ceremony will also be recorded for archival purposes and future use.

It will be attended by around 150 participants, specifically youth from 18 to 25 years of age, joining online from Europe and abroad.

After the initial discussion and concluding remarks by the speakers, the online participants will have the opportunity to engage in a Q&A session.

To date, the Opening Ceremony has featured speakers such as foreign ambassadors to Italy, high-ranking officials and experts from IFAD, as well as the representatives of the public universities of Rome. More information about the 2020 edition can be found here.

Please see below the following advice for speakers participating in a virtual event:

Before you go live:

- For a better experience, it is advised to use either Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox browsers;
- A laptop or computer is best to broadcast from, with a good quality webcam if possible;
- An external microphone will ensure better sound, but a built-in microphone will be sufficient;
- Make sure you have a strong internet speed, to ensure there is no buffering or freezing during your participation. Test the line beforehand if possible;
- Sitting back further from the computer and framing yourself in the middle of the screen is advisable.
