Associate Vice-President, Strategy and Knowledge Department, IFAD

Jyotsna Puri (or Jo) is the Associate Vice-President - Strategy and Knowledge Department (SKD) at the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), based in Rome.

At IFAD, she leads the organization's strategy work in IFAD's key areas, targeting agriculture, climate, gender, nutrition, youth, and social inclusion as well as provides the vision for evidence-informed advice on programme designs and implementation, contributing to resource mobilization, and supporting IFAD's global remit in providing state-of-the-art policy advice related to these topics. The Strategy and Knowledge Department is also responsible for ensuring that IFAD's programmes build in social, environmental and climate safeguards while ensuring that IFAD's investments generate benefits in these areas.

Puri has worked previously at the Green Climate Fund, 3ie, UNEP, the World Bank and UNDP. She is also adjunct associate professor at Columbia University, New York where she was also a research scientist. She has published in many academic journals, written for newspapers, and provided advice as a board member to several development organizations.

Donal Brown is Associate Vice-President, Programme Management Department, at IFAD. He is responsible for developing and managing the operations that IFAD supports through its loans and grants. He oversees the programme of work of the department, which is undertaken by five Regional Divisions and the Operational Policy and Results Division. Brown previously worked at the United Kingdom's

Department for International Development (DFID) in a number of senior positions, lastly as the Africa Director, managing 550 staff across the continent. Brown worked at DFID headquarters and in field offices in Africa, Asia and Latin America, covering all of DFID's areas of interest. Brown holds a Master's degree in Tropical Animal Health and Production from the University of Edinburgh, a Postgraduate Diploma in Public Leadership and Management from the University of Warwick and a Bachelor's in Veterinary Science from the University of Bristol, as well as an Honorary Doctorate in Social Justice from the University of Winchester.
