





IFAD mapping **KEY MESSAGES**



IFAD is a results oriented institution, which, over four decades, brought results reporting to the next level in terms of i) accuracy ii) specificity iii) sustainability (automatic system)

The mapping of IFAD "core indicators" (or results) to SDG goals and targets helps to ensure alignment to the SDGs and other international actors

It evidenced how IFAD is not only a green or social player, but a pure "development" player as it supports 15 SDGs
