- 2 SHEP-market/finance access collaboration

JICA's SHEP (graduated)

Motivation: Autonomy, competence, relatedness

IFAD's interventions (market/financial access)

- Market access: effective in undesirable area
- 3 Nutrition-sensitive livelihood strategy
 - Means of livelihood: biofortification, Nutripond
 - Self-determination: Choice visualizes effect
 - Preservation: additional food in lean season, cash
 - Gravity irrigation: cash in dry season, labor-time needed
