President-elect, IFAD

Alvaro Lario is an IFAD's president-elect. His will start his new duty as IFAD President in October 2022. Formerly he served as Associate Vice-President, Chief Financial Officer and Chief Controller, Financial Operations Department, at IFAD. He was part of the Executive Management Committee and was responsible for the design and implementation of the financial strategies and policies at IFAD, including oversight of the Treasury, Controller and Financial Management divisions.







Mahmoud Elies Hamza

Minister of Agriculture, Water Resources and Fisheries of the Republic of Tunisia

Mahmoud Elies Hamza is Minister of Agriculture, Water Resources and Fisheries of the Republic of Tunisia. His formerly served as Delegate of Tunisia to the CIHEAM Governing Board of Directors since June 2017. He was also at the head of the Institution of Agricultural Research and Higher Education (IRESA) since 2017.



Mr Shunsuke Takei,

State-Minister of Foreign Affairs, Japan

Shunsuke Takei is State-Minister of Foreign Affairs since August 2022 and a member of the House of Representatives (Liberal Democratic Party). He was elected for the first time in 2012. In 2016, He was appointed as Parliamentary Vice-Minister for Foreign Affairs under the Second Abe Cabinet (third reshuffle).



Takaaki Katsumata,

State-Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, Japan

Takaaki Katsumata is State-Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries since August 2022 and a member of the House of Representatives (Liberal Democratic Party). He was elected to the House of Representatives in 2012 for the first time and later re-elected 3 times. In 2018-2019, he served as Parliamentary Vice-Minister of the Environment under the Second Abe Cabinet (fourth reshuffle).

Solomon G. Ansah

Acting Director, Crop Services, Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Ghana

Dr Solomon G. Ansah is the Acting Director of Crop Services of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture. He has been a member of the National Seed Council and National Variety Release and Registration Committee since 2017 and 2012 respectively. He was the National Seed Specialist under the West Africa Seed Program who coordinated the production of climate resilient seeds, building the capacity of the private sector in seed business management. He is currently the Head of the Seed Unit of the Directorate





of Crop Services and focal point of Coalition for African Rice Development (CARD) in Ghana.



Doga Makiura

CEO of Degas Ltd.

Doga Makiura is a founder and CEO of Degas Ltd.

Since 2012, he led an agricultural business with international cooperation agencies, connecting between farmers and the market in East Africa, mainly Rwanda. Project expanded to over 30 cooperatives and over 100 tonnes of agricultural products were provided to over 100,000 people. Currently, He moved the base to Ghana and is tackling agribusiness with local people.

Mochesane Mpali is a founder and CEO of the Lema Agrivest. The company has been operating since January 2021, specializing in hydroponics farming. Their services include installation of hydroponics systems for home growers and small-scale farmers, training and consultancy services, production of fruits and vegetables and partnerships with local NGOs.

Managing Director, Nyama World

Mr Aboobakar Jakhura is a founding member and Managing Director of Nyama World. He started Malawi-based Nyama World in 2009 and focused on processing beef and goat meat for sale to the domestic market through its own outlets. Today, it operates across the complete livestock value chain: breeding, rearing and feedlot farming, processing and deboning, and selling beef and goat meat for the local and export markets.

Professor of Tokyo University of Agriculture, Director for Centre for Global Initiatives

Dr. Machito Mihara is professor at Tokyo University of Agriculture, Japan. After obtaining a doctoral degree from Tokyo University of Agriculture and Technology in 1993, he initiated his professional career at Tokyo
