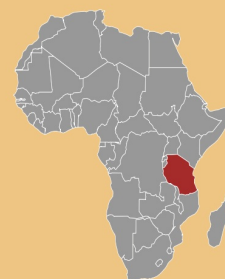

### Quick facts



Population: 45 million (2012)  
GDP per capita: US\$695 (2013)  
GDP growth rate: 7% (2013)  
Agricultural GDP growth rate: 4.2% (2013)  
Poverty rate: 28.2% (2011/12)  
Chronic malnutrition (stunting rate): 34.8% (2010-11)

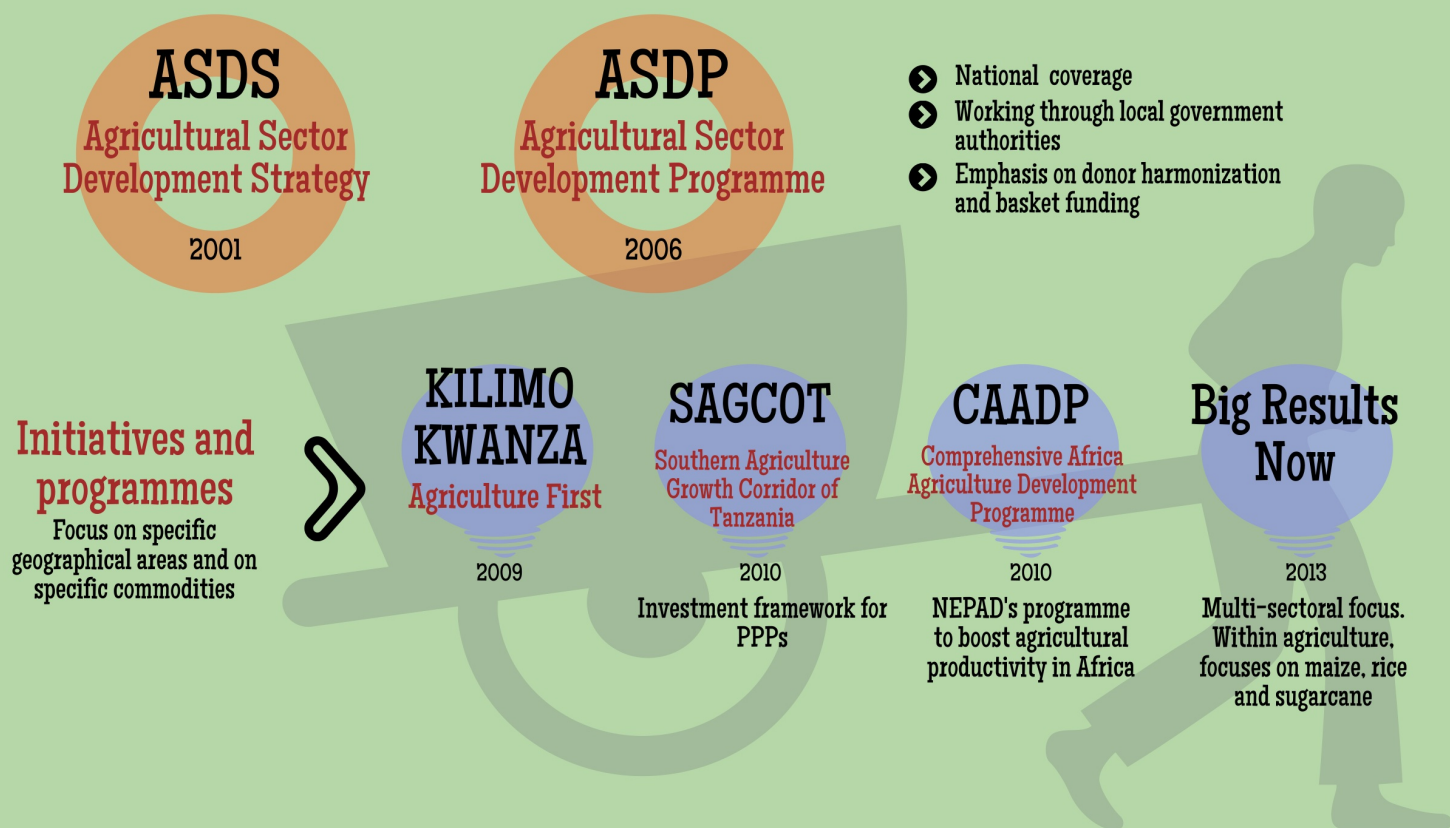

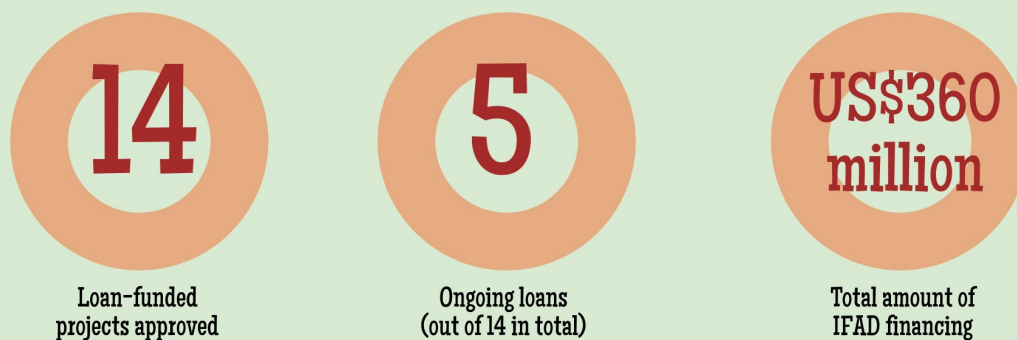

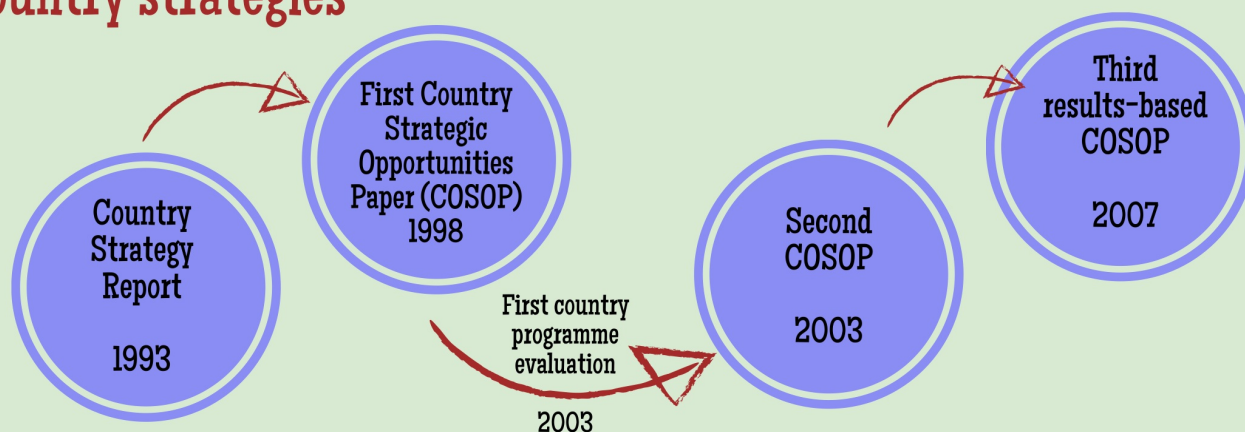
