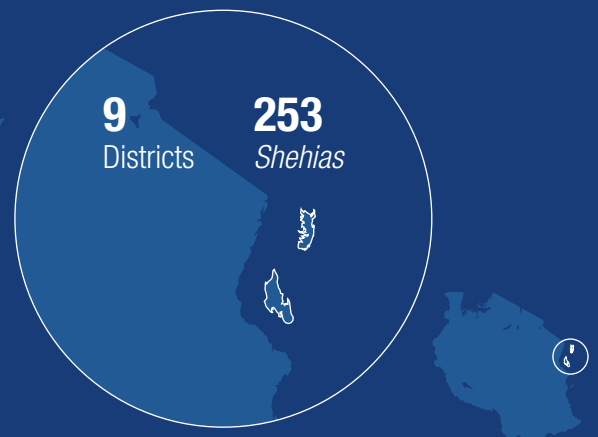

Lessons learned



Use of extension workers

Adoption of FFS practices increased when FFSs were led by extension workers instead of a farmer.



Benefits of high adoption

High adopters of FFS practices exhibited higher production, market participation, welfare, and empowerment relative to control farmers.



More focused curricula

The fragmentation of FFS activities was not conducive to sizable impacts across all activities promoted.
